Samajik Samrasta Meet held at Perth by HSS and HCA(WA), Wednesday, 14 Nov 18.

The Hindu Swaymsewak Sangh of WA organised "Samajik Samrasta", ie "Living in Harmony" meet at Scarborough, WA, on 14 Nov 18. The meet was attended by fifty nine representatives of twenty nine groups of various Hindu community organisations operating in Perth region. These organisations have significant presence and contribute to message of world peace by Hindu way of life.

The meeting was addressed by Dr Manmohan Vaidya, current All India Joint General Secretary of the Rashtriya Swayamsewak Sangh, a leading Hindu organisation of India.
