Federal Funding Brings Karma Kitchen's Vision to Life

In an increasingly isolated post-pandemic environment, this program will nourish both **bodies and minds**, offering students the sense of belonging and care they often seek.

The need for culturally appropriate **Hindu vegetarian meals**, particularly for **senior citizens**, has long gone unmet by existing food relief programs such as Meals on Wheels. This initiative not only fills that gap for the Hindu community but extends **warmth**, **inclusion**, **and sustenance** to all Australians who value healthy, plant-based meals and shared conversation.

The **government made a promise**, and today, we proudly acknowledge that **they have delivered**. Dr Charlton's unwavering support and vision for culturally inclusive, community-driven projects have been instrumental. The Hindu Council of Australia looks forward to **working closely with the government and community partners** to bring this next phase of Karma Kitchen to life, expanding its sacred mission across age groups, campuses, and communities.
